Integration between Palliative Medicine/Care and all other specialties is the core of our working day. This integration, we believe, effects the best quality of life for patients who live with advanced disease. Interventions may need to take place in the acute hospital setting; the aim being to allow patients live well at home with maximum independence.

To explore this Philosophy, we have included four patient's stories and a friend's story to bring the subjective reality both of suffering and it's complete relief to fruition.
